




Andy Lipman, 2001



Laura Rothenberg, 2003



Karen Kingsbury


A novel, powerful story about a couple whose love must face the ultimate challenge. Set in the backdrop of the rodeo scene, a couple must face the realities of living with CF.

A memoir by Gary, who at age 10 was diagnosed with CF, and now at age 46, post transplant, making the most of his life.




Nicola

Margaret writes "I asked Nicola for permission to write this book because I felt her story should be told and because she has taught me so much about living."





Myra Hauschild, 1996


This book provides an insight into the lives of cystic fibrosis sufferers. personal statements from people with CF or their families make a vivid and moving statement about living with a life-threatening illness.
